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Educational Program/Interest Area Lists

AGEC, Degree and Certificate Information

CCL - Certificate of Completion: For students who plan to complete an occupational program requiring fewer credits than a degree.

AGS - Associate in General Studies: For students whose educational goals require flexibility OR who choose to take courses which may later apply toward a degree.

AAS - Associate in Applied Science: This degree is recommended for students who wish to gain a depth of technical expertise by completing an occupational program presented in the college catalog.

AGEC - Arizona General Education Curriculum: This is a 35-38 semester-credit general education certificate that fulfills lower-division general education requirements for students planning to transfer to any Arizona public community college or university. The MCCC AGEC transfers as a block without loss of credit. All credits used to satisfy the MCCC AGEC will apply to graduation requirements of the university major for which the AGECE was designed, regardless of whether the credit was awarded for completion of course work or for prior learning. The three categories of AGECE are the AGECE-A, intended for liberal arts and other majors; the AGECE-B, intended for business majors; and the AGECE-S, intended for majors with more stringent mathematics and mathematics-based science requirements.

AA - Associate in Arts: This degree is designed for students planning to transfer to four-year colleges and universities. In general, the components of the degree meet requirements for majors in the liberal arts or programs of study other than business or science. The degree will transfer as a block without loss of credit to Arizona's public universities and other institutions with district-wide articulation agreements.

AAEE - Associate in Arts in Elementary Education: This degree includes AGECE-A and is designed for students who plan to transfer to an elementary education program at an Arizona public higher education institution and/or who plan to become a classroom instructional aide.

AAFA-Art - Associate in Arts, Fine Arts-Art: This degree includes AGECE-A and fine arts requirements in art and is for students who plan to transfer to four-year colleges and universities. The degree is designed to prepare students to meet selective admission criteria for programs such as the Bachelor of Fine Arts, which may require a portfolio or performance requirement.

AAFA-Dance - Associate in Arts, Fine Arts-Dance: This degree includes AGECE-A and fine arts requirements in dance and is for students who plan to transfer to four-year colleges and universities. The degree is designed to prepare students to meet selective admission criteria for programs such as the Bachelor of Fine Arts, which may require a portfolio or performance requirement.

AAFA-Theatre - Associate in Arts, Fine Arts-Theatre: This degree includes AGECE-A and fine arts requirements in theatre, and is for students who plan to transfer to four-year colleges and universities. The degree is designed to prepare students to meet selective admission criteria for programs such as the Bachelor of Fine Arts, which may require a portfolio or performance requirement.

AS - Associate in Science: This degree is designed for students planning to transfer to four-year colleges and universities. In general, the components of the degree meet requirements for majors with more stringent mathematics and mathematics-based science requirements. The degree will transfer as a block without loss of credit to Arizona's public universities and other institutions with district-wide articulation agreements.

ABUS - Associate in Business: This degree includes AGECE-B and is designed for students who plan to transfer to Arizona's public universities into majors that articulate with the ABUS-GR pathway and for students who plan to complete lower division course work toward a baccalaureate program at other degree-granting institutions. The ABUS-GR is for business majors and transfers as a block without loss of credit to Arizona's public universities. All credits used to satisfy the ABUS-GR will apply to university graduation requirements of the university major for which the ABUS-GR was designed. Accountancy majors should follow the Transfer Guide Pathway (TG-XR) and Computer Information System majors should follow the ABUS-SR pathway.

ATP - Associate in Arts Transfer Partnership: This degree is designed to meet the needs of students transferring to public and private colleges and universities and is specifically for students who have an identified major and have selected the baccalaureate degree-granting institution to which they intend to transfer.
