

Transit Subsidy for SCC Students

Student Eligibility requirements:

1. Must be registered FULL-TIME (12 credit hours or more) at SCC or be co-enrolled at another Maricopa college where the majority of the 12 or more credits are at SCC.
2. Must commute to campus at least one day per week via bus or light rail. NOTE: This eligibility requirement has been waived at this time due to COVID-19 and the decrease in available in-person courses.
3. Must document legal status in accordance with HB2008 through Admission & Records.

Transit Subsidy Request Process:

Contact the Center for Civic & Global Engagement at ccge@scottsdalecc.edu or fill out the request form located on the CCGE website (scottsdalecc.edu/students/commuter-information). Once you have completed the request form, please email it to ccge@scottsdalecc.edu. You will have two options to pay for and receive the bus pass:

1. Make the payment over the phone with the bookstore (480.423.6553) and receive the bus pass via mail. Students are responsible for shipping costs (\$7.50).
2. Make the payment in-person on campus at the bookstore and receive the bus pass in-person.

Fall 2021: Students may purchase a fall semester pass from August 10 - September 10, 2021. This semester pass is valid between August 15 – December 31, 2021.

Spring 2022: Students may purchase a spring semester pass from January 3 - February 4, 2022. This semester pass is valid between January 1 – May 15, 2022.

Caution: Treat your transit pass the same as cash. Lost or stolen passes cannot be replaced utilizing the Subsidy Program!

This program is for the sole use of SCC employees and/or students and may not be given to or purchased for any other person. The primary use of the transit pass is for commuting to MCCC locations. Any violation or misuse of the transit subsidy program will result in the loss of privileges. The Local Pass (Monthly) is valid for 31 days beyond the date of activation, and the semester pass is valid for four months beyond the date of activation. Subsidy is limited to one Local Pass per 31-day period per person and one Semester Pass per semester per person.
