The American Indian Program functions as a relational and support center, empowering student success through meaningful support services and resources.

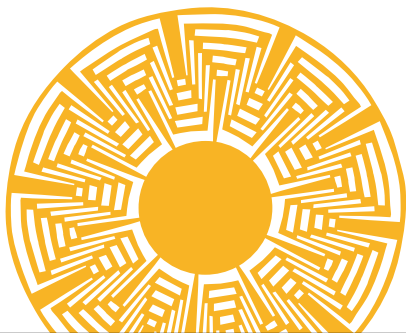
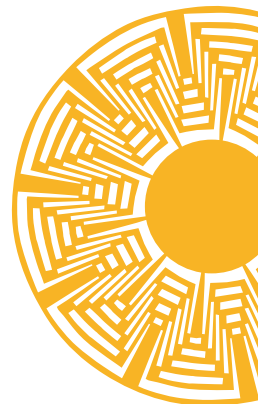
