INTERNSHIPS: GAIN WORK EXPERIENCE IN A SEMESTER

Students will gain work experience by applying academic and technical skills to upskill, reskill or enhance their employability. Organizations will host internships to preview locally grown talent and support their community.

- 84% of interns accept job offers
- 68% of interns were offered full-time roles
- Nearly 40% of employers report a five-year higher retention rate among employees they have hired via their internship program

WHAT IS AN INTERNSHIP?

We partner with approved, local, community organizations to host SCC students for 80, 160, or 240 hours during a semester-long paid internship to complete specific learning objectives. The length of an internship can vary depending on the organization, complexity of occupation and industry.

HOW TO HOST AN INTERN? It's as easy as 1-2-3...

- 1 Complete the Seeking an Intern Form
- 2 Review, e-sign and return the Experiential Education Partnership Agreement (EEPA) with the required certificate of insurance.
- Once the site is approved, you can begin reviewing materials from interested student-interns.
