SENIOR YEAR TIMELINE

Looking to start at Scottsdale Community College (SCC) next Fall? Follow this recommended timeline.



AUGUST - DECEMBER

- Talk with a SCC Representative
 - Check with your high school Career Center/Guidance Office to see if a visit is scheduled.
 - Participate in any college fairs at your school...we might be there!
 - Join Why Choose SCC, a virtual informational workshop, and meet with a recruiter.
- Check Out scottsdalecc.edu View our academic programs, registration dates, tuition, financial aid, and more!
- **Schedule a Campus Tour** Get a feel for the campus, ask questions and see the classes when you visit SCC for a tour.
- **Graduating Early?** Spring registration starts in October. Contact us for details.

JANUARY - MARCH

- Determine Your Field of Interest If you are planning on pursuing a degree or certificate, explore the <u>options available to you</u>. Please note: Not all degrees and certificates are offered at every college.
- **Get Admitted** Complete the <u>admissions application</u>. You will need to provide proof of identification during the online application process. When you finish your application, take note of the following:
 - MEID (User ID) & Password
 - Student ID Number
 - Maricopa Email

- Account We recommend
- **Set Up Your Student Center Account** Activate your <u>Maricopa Student Email Account</u>. We recommend forwarding your email to the personal email account.
- Create a Plan to Pay for College While there may not be a single right answer to paying for college, researching your options early will help you create a plan that works best for you.
- Apply for Financial Aid & Scholarships
 - Complete the <u>FAFSA</u> open in October of each year.
 - Complete the <u>Maricopa Community Colleges Foundation General Scholarship</u> application. Open March 1- April 30, one application for hundreds of scholarships.
 - Continue to research and apply for scholarships.

APRIL - JUNE

Complete Tasks in Your Student Center

- Determine Placement through the <u>Testing Center</u>. We use multiple ways to identify course placement for your success.
- Meet Your Advisor Your advisor will help you understand your program, discuss your graduation goal, and help guide you in building your first semester class schedule. Visit Advisor Appointments and choose the advisor that aligns with your program.
- Register for Classes Fall registration begins in late March. Search for class schedules online and discuss with your advisor to be sure you are on track.

JULY - AUGUST

- Begin Orientation at SCC Orientation designed to help you learn important things about being an SCC student. It is not a one-time event though. It is a combination of online activities, meeting our professors, and registering for a first semester course.
- Join Artie's Welcome During Artie's Welcome you get the opportunity to meet the many individuals that will teach and support you through to graduation.
- Pay Tuition and Fees Review your payment options. Not sure which payment options are available to you? Schedule an appointment with Student Business Services to review your options.
- Purchase or Rent Textbooks Book information is listed in your online class schedule. You can purchase or rent textbooks from the SCC Bookstore, or at other online vendors before the first day of class.

HELPFUL FINANCIAL AID & SCHOLARSHIP TIPS

- Attend financial aid/college workshops.
- Note any specific deadlines and apply early.
- Check the Financial Aid webpage often.
- Apply for any scholarships before you graduate from high school because you may need to ask a teacher or counselor for a letter of recommendation.
- Search for Open Educational Resources (OER) courses with no cost or low cost (<\$40) textbooks.
- SCC also offers a monthly payment plan, textbook rentals, and free parking!

PRESIDENTS' HONORS SCHOLARSHIP

Recent Maricopa County high school graduates who have a final unweighted 3.25 GPA may qualify for this scholarship which covers in-county tuition for up to 15 credit hours for four semesters.

HONORS ACHIEVEMENT AWARD

After completing 12 credits (100+ level classes) at SCC with a 3.25 GPA or better, you may qualify for an award of up to \$500 per semester.
