ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS

- Be enrolled at Scottsdale Community College
- Be part-time (6+ credits) or full-time (12+ credits)
- Be a member of a federally or state-recognized
 Tribe or Canadian First Nation
- Be pursuing a business-related degree or certificate (e.g., Accounting, Management, Marketing, Entrepreneurship)
- Be an Arizona resident
- Submit the FAFSA and meet Satisfactory Academic Progress (SAP)
- Be enrolled in:
- At least 2 business courses (full-time) or
- At least 1 business course (part-time)
- Not have previously earned a degree

- 3–5 short essay responses
