



Eligible students must:

- Be currently enrolled at Scottsdale Community College
- Enroll in 6 or more credits (part-time or full-time)
- Belong to a federally or state-recognized Tribe or a Canadian First Nation
- Reside in Arizona and meet in-state residency requirements
- Maintain a minimum 2.0 cumulative GPA
- Complete the FAFSA and meet Satisfactory Academic Progress (SAP)
- Pursue a financial aid-eligible degree or certificate
- Note: Students already receiving a Maricopa Grant through financial aid are not eligible
