STEP 1

GET ADMITTED admissions.maricopa.edu

Questions? Visit the Welcome Center for in-person assistance or call the Helpdesk at 1-888-994-4433. You will use your MEID to log on to all student tools and Student ID # for registration and academic support.

Provide additional documentation Admissions and Records (SS-136), (480) 423-6100

- **Proof of identity** Provide a government-issued photo ID in-person at Admissions and Records, or online
- **Citizenship/Lawful Presence and Residency**
To determine eligibility for in-state tuition, you must provide documentation verifying your citizenship status (required by law) and residency in-person at Admissions and Records, or online

Activate your Maricopa email account

- Log in to your online Student Center at my.maricopa.edu and select 'Student Email'
- Your Maricopa email address will be your MEID@maricopa.edu. All official college messages will be sent to this email address

STEP 2

DETERMINE PLACEMENT TESTING OPTIONS

Effective 10/4/18, your High School GPA may be used for class placement if:

- You have completed at least 2 years of high school within the last 10 years **AND** you have an unofficial high school transcript with a 2.6 cumulative or higher, unweighted GPA
- Bring unofficial transcripts to the SCC Testing Center (SC 150)
 - Note: for other purposes such as Financial Aid, etc. you may also need to have an **official** transcript sent by your high school to the SCC Admissions & Records Office
- Advisors will review your GPA placement for English, Reading and Math at your SOAR session (for new students) or in an advising session (for continuing students)
- Transfer Students: If you have completed college level coursework in English, Reading or Math, you will need to bring unofficial transcripts of all coursework completed when you meet with an academic advisor in Academic and Career Advisement

Effective 10/4/18, you must complete the ACCUPLACER Placement Test if:

- Your high school GPA is below 2.6
- You have been out of high school for more than 10 years and have not completed college coursework in English, Reading, or Math from another college
- You wish to place in higher classes than your GPA allows
- You are enrolling in Dual/Concurrent Enrollment classes while still in high school and do not have one of the State required scores listed on the Dual/Concurrent enrollment form **AND/OR** do not meet the high school GPA requirements listed above
 - Students under the age of 18 must meet State enrollment requirements **AND** course placement requirements

HOW TO TAKE THE ACCUPLACER PLACEMENT TEST Testing Center (SC-150), 480-423-6433

- New students that are not exempt from testing based on one of the areas above must take all three sections (WritePlacer, Reading Comprehension & Math) of the placement test before registering. Test is untimed but plan for an average of 2 - 2 1/2 hours.
- Photo ID and SCC Student ID number are required for all testing.

ORIENTATION & ADVISEMENT

ALL students:

- Review SCC's Online Orientation at orientation.scottsdalecc.edu for a general overview, then complete one of the options below:

New college students: ATTEND A SOAR SESSION* (includes Advisement & Registration)

- All new students must attend SOAR (Scottsdale New Student Orientation, Advising & Registration) to get advised and register for classes. (2.5 hour session)

- If you will be under 18 **at the time of registration**, the 'Financial Responsibility and Consent Form' must be completed and signed by a parent/guardian to be eligible to register at SOAR

Students with prior college credit: MEET WITH AN ADVISOR & register for classes

- Bring unofficial transcripts of all college coursework completed to meet with an academic advisor in the Academic and Career Advising Center

CREATE A PLAN TO PAY FOR TUITION & FEES Cashier's Office (SS-136) 480-423-6148

One of the (3) payment options below must be made on the day of registration to secure your class(es). Effective October 2018, the registration processing fee is non-refundable.

PAYMENT OPTIONS:

Option 1 - FINANCIAL AID AND SCHOLARSHIP STUDENTS: If you have been awarded and accepted your financial aid (grants, loans, or scholarships) and your award covers the full cost of your tuition and fees, your classes are secured. If your financial aid award is less than your tuition and fees, please make payment arrangements to cover the balance.

Option 2 - PAYMENT PLAN: Sign up for a monthly payment plan to secure your class(es) on the day you register. The payment plan must be set up online and you can learn more about paying using a payment plan by logging in to your my.maricopa.edu Student Center account. This requires a \$15.00 down payment and a \$20.00 payment plan fee per semester for a total of \$35.00 (non-refundable) to secure your class(es). Reloadable prepaid cards may be used to set up payment plan.

Option 3 - PAY IN FULL: You may pay tuition in full using Debit/Credit Card or pay by Checking/Savings Account. Log into your My.maricopa.edu Student Center account or visit the Cashier's Office to pay in person.

Additional Notes...

- Through SOAR or your advising meeting, be sure to register for one of the departmental specific orientations
- Check your Student Center To-Do Lists (my.maricopa.edu) for important status updates on your Financial Aid
- Make a plan to check your college email regularly or Welcome Center staff can also assist you with forwarding it to a personal email account

- Supplemental Enrollment Guide - SOAR for New Students 2 1/2 hour session

This supplemental handout should be reviewed in addition to the Enrollment Guide above that lists the complete steps 1-4. The following information is related to Step 3 and is geared for students who are new to college.

SOAR (Scottsdale Orientation, Advising, and Registration) is **mandatory** for all students who are new to college and seeking a degree or certificate, or taking general studies classes. All recent high school graduates must attend SOAR, even if you took college classes through ACE, Dual Enrollment or Hoop of Learning while in high school.
